



Are the deities worshipping lamps safe in your house?

Deities worshipping lamps are subject to mandatory inspection by the Bureau of Standards, Metrology and Inspection (BSMI). Consumers should check the presence of “Commodity

Inspection Mark” ( or ) when purchasing the products. The authenticity of the

Mark can be verified on the BSMI official website (http://civil.bsmi.gov.tw/bsmi_pqn/index.jsp) or the toll-free number: +886-800-007-123.

Consumers are advised to note the following points when purchasing or using the lamps:

- (1) To check whether the specification (voltage, power or current), model, name and address of the manufacturer are indicated on the package. Most importantly, the Commodity Inspection Mark should be labelled or printed on the product itself.
- (2) To stop using lamps, of which the power cord is single-layered insulation with groove and of which the lamp holder is shattered. In such cases, contact the seller or the BSMI immediately for assistance.
- (3) To avoid placing heavy items, such as chair lags on top of the power cord to prevent short circuits resulted from deteriorated insulation and coating.
- (4) To prevent the incense and its ashes from being in contact with the lamps and its power cord and to avoid high temperature and sources of fire when using the lamps to prevent fire incidents.
