6.	<b>Description of content:</b> The Separate Customs Territory of Taiwan, Penghu, Kinmen and Matsu intends to regulate the safety requirements for Information Technology (IT) equipment that are already subject to EMC requirements. As of July 1, 2005, all such products must further conform to the safety requirements when imported or marketed. The inspection requirements are CNS standards that have been harmonized with relevant IEC or CISPR standards. This notice also provides the applicable conformity assessment procedures.  The notice covers a total of 45 items of IT equipment, 18 being subject to Declaration of Conformity scheme and 25 being subject to a dual-track approach (Registration of Product Certification or Type-approved Batch Inspection). The rest 2 items, being static converters for automatic data processing machine and switching power supplies, are subject to Registration of Product Certification (a change of the EMC conformity assessment procedure for these two items from currently Declaration of Conformity to Registration of Product Certification is also proposed as a result of a review of the effectiveness the conformity assessment procedure applied).
